



STILL GAINING MOMENTUM

Early in the company's history someone approached me with the critique that TekSynap (then Synaptek) was just another Beltway Bandit in a sea of small businesses in the Washington DC metropolitan area. My response then was "yes we were – but the difference is that we are the *very best* of the Beltway Bandits." Our focus on employees and customers makes us different from our peers in the industry. Today, TekSynap has over 950 employees and will, for the first time, cross the \$200 million revenue mark.

To enable this growth and the future growth beyond, we needed to do three things. First, we had to succeed and grow inside our legacy cornerstone programs. Second, we had to grow into new agencies and establish new customers. Third, we have to continue to invest in future growth and expanding that market footprint, yet again.

I am happy to report success and growth in all four of our cornerstone legacies: the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA), Defense Threat Reduction Agency (DTRA), Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), and Department of Veterans Affairs. There are too many people to name that have contributed to the success on these programs – but I would like to recognize the leadership of key individuals that have kept the TekSynap culture and values at the forefront of performance enabling program success:

Stone Baggiano and her team have performed, and are performing, on over 60 task orders at DLA. This includes worldwide support to the DLA customer under the Enterprise Service Delivery (ESD) task, which has our first full-time OCONUS staff. TekSynap is now truly global.

Warren McQueen and his team at DTRA have expanded beyond the 3 core service tasks at DTRA (IT Operations, Cyber, Test and Integration) to support various DTRA mission areas and systems. We now have 11 tasks supporting a wide range of requirements, as we enter the latter half of a 10-year contract.

Ray Caruso, Chris Schuster, and their team have moved our efforts beyond the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's core IT and engineering; we now maintain and enhance NRC's key mission applications.

Frank Amrhein and Don James have expanded our partnership with AT&T at the Department of Veterans Affairs. Along with our growing OEM partnership with Juniper/MIST, we are moving the VA to a modern technology platform that will form the basis for many exciting programs in the future – such as patient way-finding and other patient engagement

capabilities, enabling better service to our nation's veteran community.

Achieving the second step in our path to success in the last couple of years we have established new customers and new avenues for growth. Examples include the Army, Commerce National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), Homeland Security-Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), and Interior. Again, while there are too many people to thank for the success of these programs, I would like to recognize a few: MJ Helveston and Jason Ballah have established major inroads within the Army customer, supporting 12 different commands. We supply a diverse set of services including security services, training, knowledge management, mission exercise support, and leading-edge cloud-based services under the DENIX program.

Bianca Berrios has led the charge at both Commerce NOAA and DHS CISA. We are now the enterprise support contractor to NOAA under the SBITS task order - with new application development services spinning up for Fisheries, and have a firm entry into the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) with our support to CISA.

Tami Devitt has firmly established TekSynap as a service leader within the Department of Interior (DOI), Bureau of Safety and Environmental Enforcement (BSEE), and Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM); where we recently won our first recompete.

Fulfilling the third requirement in our plan, we are not resting on our laurels. TekSynap is investing in expanding to new customers; we have active engagements and bids under evaluation:

Susan Case and her team are expanding into the Intelligence community.

Ray Caruso and Warren McQueen, supported by Peter Tao, are collaborating to open the Department of State. In parallel, Garrick Yahnke and Tom Murphy are leveraging our relationship with AT&T to survey and deploy to embassies across the world. We have just completed our first survey missions in Nigeria with many, many more to come.

Troy Walters is making us a force within the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI). We have our first positions supporting the FBI TACU and active pursuits across the FBI's technical requirements including the Washington D.C. headquarters, FBI Criminal Justice Information Services (CGIS), and FBI Field Offices. We are still waiting to hear on key awards out of "TekSynap West" – that were submitted under Joe Walker's leadership.

Collectively, these efforts keep Julie Ennis' proposal, Mark Sikorski's Architecture teams, and Kearstin McGinnis' recruiting team hopping at all times. They have an incredible capability to best represent the "Why TekSynap" story to our prospective customers and potential new hires. These teams are a big part of the TekSynap growth story.

None of TekSynap's growth would be possible without the outstanding efforts of our back office – Recruiting, Human Resources, Accounting, Quality, Security, Contracts, Procurement, HQ and IT Services. These teams continue to outperform their counterparts in much larger companies. Their accomplishments are too many to list in this article – Kam will be writing about these in January's newsletter. For those of you that have utilized corporate services, you know that these respective teams rock!

The last few days have been very gratifying – I have heard from a member of the TekSynap family that she was able to buy her first home, from another employee about TekSynap enabling a career change, and a third's experience just graduating from college and launching their career with TekSynap. So many people have expressed that TekSynap is the best company for which they have ever worked. It is fulfilling to have the vision that Kam and I had so many years ago come to fruition – to build the kind of company for which we would want to work. However, the credit is not Kam's or mine. It is a collective success. Each of you has made contributions to create something special in TekSynap. It is in the way we treat

each other and the care that we take in doing our very best as a team for our customers. The TekSynap management team has spent the last year reading books about companies and team cultures – the intangible aspects that differentiate good from great. It is very hard to define the recipe. It includes accountability, support, risk-taking, ingenuity, caring, listening, and so many other factors... Whatever it is - this team has it. It is humbling to be a part of it, I know I am very grateful for the professionalism and technical expertise, that you display each day, which has earned TekSynap a reputation for excellence.

Now, TekSynap is a leading mid-tier government contractor in the federal market space. While we have differentiated ourselves from many of our competitors and have emerged as one of a limited number of agile, independent businesses in our market area; we must continue to embrace that same focus on employees and customers that enabled that early success. The superstars on-contract that we have across the company are too many to mention in this article. You are the lifeblood of the company and I am grateful every day for your efforts. It is your outstanding capabilities that will allow us to compete on this new level.

TekSynap has a rocket image that appears each year in the January issue of our newsletter. A few years ago, I talked about how we were in a middle stage and still accelerating – that proved to be true, but rocket burn is not over yet. We are still gaining momentum.




Hilda Esposito's little joy, Piggy. She loves treats and taking long naps.



A Holiday OPSEC Message

Operations Security, or OPSEC Helps Us Maintain Essential Secrecy By Denying Our Critical Information To Adversaries
